
Praying the rosary is really special.

When you pray the rosary you are invited to think deeply about the life of Jesus. You are asking Mary to help you learn how to be more and more like Jesus in your daily life.


Why are they called mysteries?

They're all called "mysteries" because you can think about them for a very long time and still not understand everything about them.

Here's how to use those "mysterious" rosary beads of yours:



- Start here. Make the sign of the cross and pray the Apostles' Creed
- Pray the Our Father
- Pray the Hail Mary



- Announce the first mystery and pray the Our Father
- Announce the first rPray ten Hail Marys
- Pray the Glory after the last Hail Mary
 - Repeat from 5, using the second mysteries. Continue until all five mysteries of that series are finished. Pray the Hail Holy Queen

Joyful mysteries (pray on Monday & Saturday) The Annunciation-Mary becomes the Mother of God Mary visits and helps St. Elizabeth. Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem. Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to the Temple. Jesus is found in the Temple.

Luminous mysteries (pray on Thursday)

The Baptism of Jesus The Miracle of the Wedding at Cana The Preaching of Jesus The Transfiguration-Three of the apostles see Jesus shining with God's glory. The Last Supper-Jesus gives us his Body and Blood-a great mystery!

Sorrowful mysteries (pray on Tuesday & Friday)

Jesus prays in the Garden Jesus is tied and whipped The Crowning with Thorns The Carrying of the Cross The Crucifixion

Glorious mysteries (pray on Wednesday & Sunday)

Jesus rises from the dead Jesus goes back to heaven The Holy Spirit comes down Mary is taken into heaven Mary is crowned Queen

<u>Hail Holy Queen</u>

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To you do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to you do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, your eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of your womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
